Terms and Definitions

- <u>Uttermost</u> (Gk. panteles) Complete. Sense: to a complete degree or to a full or entire extent (Bible Sense Lexicon)
- <u>To Save</u> (Gk. *sozo*) To deliver; to rescue
- Savior (Gk. *soter*) Deliverer; Rescuer
- <u>Salvation</u> (Gk. soteria) Deliverance
- <u>Soteriology</u> the study of salvation. [Soteria (salvation) + ology (study)]
- Yeshua Hebrew word for "salvation" and the Hebrew name of Jesus.
- Reconcile (Gk. *katallasso*) to restore someone to favorable or friendly relations with another after a presumed wrong
- Atonement (Heb. Kippur) appease; make amends. "At-one-ment"
- <u>Redeem</u> (Gk. exagorazo) deliver; to buy back, usually via payment of a ransom. It carries
 with it the idea of being set free from chains or slavery. (Bible Sense Lexicon)
- <u>Substitutionary</u> the act, process, or result of substituting one thing for another. (Merriam-Webster Dictionary)
- <u>Substitutionary Atonement</u> Also referred to as Vicarious Atonement Christ died "in the place of," or as a substitute for sinners.
